As I wrote last week, we received bids on expanding our parish hall last Thursday. received three of them. Now we finally know what it will cost to carry out the plans we've made. cost, including architect's fees and assuming a 5% overage for contingencies is \$780,000. Presently we have about \$266,000 in our building fund, which means we have to raise another \$514,000. asked Tom Lilly to help us try and raise this money. Tom has quite a bit of experience in fundraising and offers his services to us free of charge. So, you'll be receiving a letter in the mail very soon regarding the campaign we'll be conducting. In May we'll be asking to see what everyone is willing to give. Adding on to our hall and making it more appropriate for larger parish gatherings is costly, but is certainly doable. Let's all pray for God's guidance in this matter.

Also by the time you read this, some members of the Parish Hall Expansion Committee and I will have met with the Diocesan Building Committee on Thursday to get their input into our expansion plans and as part of the diocesan approval process.

We will put a drawing of our plans on display again at masses on the weekend of April 28-29. Any questions you have can be directed to me, a member of the Expansion Committee (Matt Buckman, Paul Cassidy, Linda Baird and Bob Buckman), or a member of the Parish Council.

I will be gone Monday - Friday next week.

I'll be traveling with the 8th graders from John Paul

II to Washington, DC. So, there won't be any 8:00

a.m. mass next week.
