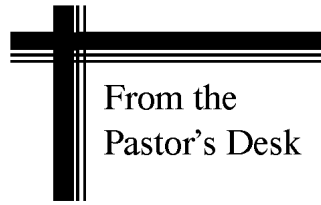

COMMUNION TO SICK – Linda Baird

The Knot Prayer
Author Unknown

Dear God,

Please untie the knots that are in my mind, my heart, and my life.

Pardon one another so that later on you will not remember the injury. The recollection of an injury is itself wrong. It adds to our anger, nurtures our sin and hates what is good. It is a rusty arrow and poison for the soul. It puts all virtue to flight."

Two things went by recently, and perhaps without a whole lot of notice. The first thing is the memorial of St. Agnes. The day we remember her in the Church calendar is January 21, which was Monday of last week. She was martyred when she was only 12 or 13 years old on January 21, 304.

She is the patroness of our parish, meaning that she watches over us, she has a connection with us and she intercedes for us before God. This points out our belief called the Communion of Saints. The word 'communion' literally means 'union with,' suggesting that we have a union with those who are in heaven - the saints. We can still have a relationship with those who are already in eternity. We typically say we pray "to" a saint, but we are actually praying to God through the intercession of that saint. Just as we ask other people to pray for us here on earth, so we do the same with those in heaven.

It would have been nice to have had a special celebration honoring St. Agnes but it's a little difficult with our parish hall not available. Perhaps we can do something in the future.

The other thing is the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. This was on Tuesday Of last week, January 22. This date was chosen because it is the day of the U. S. Supreme Court's decision in Roe vs. Wade in 1973. As I imagine you're aware, that decision opened the door for legalized abortion in our country. What we're asked to do each year on Jan. 22 is to undertake some kind of penitential practice, along with prayer, to seek God's help in stopping the killing of unborn children as a legal practice in our nation.

Not everyone agrees that abortion is wrong. Some people choose to not see it as the taking of human life, and the issue remains a source of conflict. Even our legal system is conflicted about it. On the one hand, it's legal to abort babies when a mother wishes. On the other hand, there have been cases in which a pregnant woman has been murdered and the perpetrator was prosecuted for two murders, the mother and the child in her womb. So, we pray that this scourge be removed from our land.
